General information: Cost is \$325 per rider for those who are USHJA Zone 8 **AND** AHJA members; \$375 per rider for AHJA members; and \$425 for other riders. **Riders should send a \$100 deposit check along with this application. You can also request us to invoice you through PayPal for the deposit if you wish to pay with a credit card.** The deposit will be applied to your clinic fee when you arrive and register for the clinic. Riders who apply and are not able to attend should notify AHJA as soon as possible – if we can fill your spot with a rider from the waiting list, we'll refund your deposit. **If we cannot fill your spot, your deposit will not be refunded.** Stalls are available free from Friday through Sunday; shavings can be purchased from the Fairgrounds, or bring your own.

Horses and riders will be grouped by ability, in groups of no more than 6 riders for each two-hour clinic session. Groups will be organized by ability level, from 2'6" to 3'6" (or higher), depending on demand.
